


Christian Dental Society News-Brief February 2022



CDS members are going on dental missions and renting equipment to numerous places around the globe to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Many are finding ways to serve and there continues to be a strong interest in dental volunteerism, as evidenced by those contacting the CDS about missions at our home office and dental conventions. Dr. Gayle Cheatwood's dental/vision/medical/outreach mission trip to Oaxaca, Mexico in January 2022 was a shining example of a successful, multi-functional, cross-cultural, Christian outreach, mission trip despite COVID-19. The team consisted of 32 Americans with six dentists, one hygienist, seven dental assistants, two sterilization attendants, three pharmacy staff, two eyeglass technicians, four health check and triage personnel, and one physician. Other team members included pastors, translators, and children's ministry workers. This trip was special in that three Mexican dentists from Mexicali attended. It feels good to have local dentists get involved and they did a great job.

We seemed to meet with resistance every step of the way. I call it spiritual warfare. On the first day, the church had no electricity. We prayed, then went ahead by faith, and set all the equipment up. Four of the dental units were run off solar power using two car batteries. After a while, even though it was obvious the transformers were blown on the power pole outside the church, the electricity came on. We ended up having a productive time and spent the following day there also.

The third clinic day was up in the mountains about an hour and a half away on a very, windy road. The bus stopped a couple of times for those who got car sick to get out. Again we prayed and by the time we arrived everyone was feeling better. The town was called Tiltapec and the people were from the Chachino Indian tribe. They were mostly farmers growing corn, vegetables, and coffee for export and were gentle, caring people. There were around 3,000 Chachinos in the area and over 300 attend church. We were

impressed that ten percent of the population goes to church. We had interpreters that translated from Chachino to Spanish to English. The weather remained comfortable and the scenery was beautiful.

Our fourth clinic day was very busy in a small church near Puerto Escondido. We took out some third molars and a portable x-ray, sensor, and computer software made the extractions easier. We could see what we were getting into and could formulate a game plan.

Each night we would meet on the second floor of the hotel in a meeting room and have a short time of praise and worship. We had a couple of gifted worship song leaders, Dr. Kent Neubert from Wyoming and Joe Godwin from Utah. Each night one of the team members would bring a short devotional. The devotionals were inspiring and, even though the meetings were optional, everyone looked forward to them. Even some of the locals joined in.

The final attack on the team occurred when our flights home to Mexicali were canceled. Again we prayed and Pastor Moore got alternative flights to Tijuana where we walked across to the U.S. We were picked up by church members who drove us two hours back to the Imperial Valley.

It feels good to get back into doing missions. We have one this week in Rocky Point, South of Lukeville, Arizona, at a men's shelter. Someone donated a mobile unit which a men's group transported there and we will be setting it up this weekend to work on the men.

I have a young, Haitian, farmer friend who goes to our church and I invited him to translate and share the gospel, which excited him.

Many times, you help those who go with you more than those you minister to. God just tells us to go and make disciples.


