


## Christian Dental Society News-Brief March 2022

Dr. Dave Moretz, CDS's past president, ran the CDS exhibit booth at the recent Hinman meeting in Atlanta and the CDS had a very successful meeting. Although the attendance and exhibitors were down by about 75%, the CDS booth had lots of traffic. Dr. Moretz sold pressure pot weights for sterilization, CDS mission manuals, and a CDS dental chair and stool. Much CDS literature was distributed. An endo kit was donated by a CDS member, along with opportunities for receiving DNLT hygiene units. Connections were made with Atlanta Dental for supplies. Drs. Bob and Diane Meyer

along with Dr. Andrew Walls will be at the Oregon Dental Convention in Portland, Oregon on April 7-9.

From March 16-26, CDS members participated on a student dental mission trip to Guatemala lead by Dr. T. Bob Davis to open up a new 21-chair dental facility which was built through his efforts. Drs. Bob and Diane Meyer and Dr. Jody Yarbrow setup and ran the operations of the clinic. Dr. Dylan Patrick, working with local anesthesiologists, treated difficult pediatric patients in the operating room, which is the first time this has been done by CDS members in a developing world country. The mission trip is focused on giving dental students a heart for Christian dental missionary service and works primarily on school children.

The clinic was plumbed through a box shelf containing a compressed air line to Aseptico units with a water bottle, air-water syringe, and high-speed and slow-speed air handpieces. A suction line was run to support high-volume evacuation and slow-speed suction. The chairs were built out of plywood and 1.5 x1.5-inch lumber for \$10 each. The doctor and assistant stools were foldable Camptime stools which provided good back support. This system is very workable, inexpensive, and designed to be easily and rapidly packed up and moved to a storage room in this multi-use facility.

The 21-chair clinic was organized into two sections of 10 chairs each with one chair at the end for x-rays done with a Nomad and scanners hooked to a computer. The CDS 4-quart Presto pressure pot with the ring weight was able to keep up with 10 chairs.

Dr. Dylan Patrick brought a staff of five people with a goal of setting up an operating room for the children who could not be treated in the clinic. He had seen the great need in past trips to Guatemala and, on his own initiative, used the existing medical clinic (which had an operating room) situated below the dental clinic to personally pay for two local anesthesiologists, a recovery nurse and necessary medications to help him put children to sleep and treat a myriad of dental problems on children.

Five U.S. dental students from Houston joined the trip, had positive experiences, and joined the CDS. Note that dental or hygiene students who go on a dental mission trip and sign the CDS statement of faith are offered free CDS memberships until the end of December of their graduation year. We welcome them to the CDS and look forward to a larger group joining the Guatemalan trip next year.
